

## Bethune-Cookman University

Bethune-Cookman University has two openings to be filled by qualified individuals who will be available to start in January 2012.

The first open position is for a broadly trained sociologist who will teach a diverse range of introductory level and upper level courses as assigned to meet the course needs in the sociology program. Online teaching experience is a plus, but is not required. Also, excellence in teaching and a commitment to scholarship and service are required. The successful candidate will teach five courses each semester. Qualifications include Ph.D., ABD, or MA in Sociology.

The second open position is for a sociologist whose area is in aging, or the candidate will have at least 18 graduate credit hours in aging studies/gerontology. The successful candidate will teach introductory level and upper level courses as assigned to meet the course needs in the gerontology program. Online teaching experience is a plus, but is not required. Also, excellence in teaching and a commitment to scholarship and service are required. The successful candidate will teach five courses each semester. Qualifications include Ph.D., ABD, or Master's Degree in Sociology (with at least 18 credit hours in graduate level aging/gerontology courses). Also, a Ph.D., ABD, or Master's degree in Aging Studies or Gerontology will meet qualifications for this second open position.
