

Northeastern University: Gender

The Department of Sociology and Anthropology announces a tenure-track opening for a sociologist of gender, beginning in the Fall of 2009. A Ph.D. in sociology is required at the time of appointment. The rank of the position is open. We are especially interested in considering applicants with expertise in quantitative research methods, though scholars relying on qualitative, historical, and other methods will also be considered. We also wish to encourage applicants whose substantive areas encompass fields such as globalization, the intersectionality of gender, class, race, ethnicity or religion, and social inequality. The ability to teach graduate-level feminist methods and/or feminist theory courses would be a plus. The Department is a strong and growing unit with a well-established Ph.D. program, and whose faculty are committed to excellence in research, scholarship, and teaching. Northeastern University is a large, private institution located in the heart of Boston. The Women's Studies Program is a founding and active member in the Graduate Consortium in Women's Studies at MIT. Women and members of historically excluded groups are especially encouraged to apply.
