

Saint Leo University, a liberal arts institution rooted in the Benedictine tradition, is currently recruiting a full-time, tenure-track sociologist for its Atlanta centers. Area of specialization is open, but preference will be given to a generalist who can teach a variety of lower- and upper-level courses, including several core sociology courses (introduction to sociology, quantitative and qualitative research methods, sociological theory, and senior seminar). Other responsibilities include advising students, mentoring and observing adjunct instructors, and assisting the Social Science department chair with Sociology students and faculty at Saint Leo University's Atlanta centers.

Saint Leo University serves over 15,000 students on its main campus in Florida, in 17 continuing education centers across 7 states, and through its Center for Online Learning. We are a leading provider of higher education on military bases. The position will be based at the South Atlanta Center in Morrow, with teaching also taking place in the Gwinnett center and through video teaching. Because of the large number of non-traditional students served, most of the teaching is scheduled in the evening and on week-ends, in 8-week terms.

The appointment will be at the Assistant or Associate Professor, depending on prior experience. A Ph.D. is preferred but ABD candidates will be considered, with degree completed by the expected time of hire in July 2012. Teaching experience at an accredited University with demonstrated proficiency in the classroom is required; experience teaching non-traditional students, a diverse student body, and/or teaching in non-traditional settings (such as video or online teaching) is preferred. The position will remain open until filled, with review of applications starting on March 1st, 2012.
