Candidates should have a research and teaching record meriting appointment at the rank of Professor (field open, but Ph.D. required) and evidence of academic leadership and administrative abilities. Teaching load is normally two courses per semester. Starting date is July 1, 2010.

The department includes 22 tenure-track faculty, 550 undergraduate majors and 60 graduate students. It also provides service courses to over 1000 students. The new department head will be expected to provide the vision and leadership necessary for enhancing the national reputation of the programs and providing quality education for undergraduate and graduate students.
